23/149 Chairman's Report



Action

1. The Chairman reminded Councillors that nomination forms for the new Council needed to be completed and at Forde House (TDC) by 4pm on Tuesday 4 April.

23/150 Clerk's Report

- 1. Devon County Council (DCC) had made an order for a 6-month temporary closure of Footpath 60 (between Chudleigh Road and Dawlish Road) due to work on the South West Exeter development.
- 2. A resident had asked about a unit located on a tall column in Reddaway Drive. It was confirmed by that it was a Telensa base station that was used for smart streetlight monitoring.
- 3. The safety inspection reports for the play equipment at Deepway Green had been received. There were no urgent matters to attend to.

23/151 <u>To update Council on a meeting held with Police Constable David</u> <u>Hawkins, the Chairman and Cllr Aird to discuss Highways issues</u>

PC Hawkins and colleagues had monitored speeds through the village on several occasions and had not witnessed a significant problem.

This was not the experience of the Community Speedwatch group. PC Hawkins offered to meet with the group, potentially attending Speedwatch session in a location where speeding had been recorded in the past.

PC Hawkins offered to source some mobile Vehicle Activated Signs (VAS) that could be installed temporarily. This would allow the Parish Council to evaluate their effectiveness before committing to buy some. VAS had been installed in Chudleigh, but they were largely ignored.

A meeting with DCC was being arranged to discuss road safety issues.

PROPERTY & AMENITIES MATTERS

23/153 <u>To consider a request from a Resident asking permission to metal detect</u> on Parish Council land

Research had been undertaken and the vast majority of Town and Parish Councils did not allow metal detecting. TDC had advised that it was not allowed at the Ridgetop Park citing potential risk to biodiversity.



Action

Of those that did allow it, photographic permit schemes were in place (involving enforcement) and detectorists were required to be members of national bodies and hold public liability insurance.

There were also examples where detecting could be carried out at the discretion of the council. This was usually in cases where personal valuables had been lost and no digging was required.

It was agreed to defer a decision on the matter until June.
